SPECIAL AWARDS

Wayne P. Sorrentino National Directeur As you read this article (sometime in late April or early May), you have less than 1 month to research, complete and send your Special Awards nomination to your Grande Leadership.



Now is the time to step it up and complete the process by reading the nominations instructions in the FOUR PAGES of the Special Awards Report found on National's website under RESOURCES, FORMS & SPECIAL AWARDS REPORT.

Our Special Awards Sous Directeur's have been working very hard writing and submitting their monthly guidance letters to our Grande Leaderships, requesting your cooperation with generating the nominations for each of our FOUR categories. These letters, of course, need to be pushed by the Grande's Leadership to the Voitures Locale level so the WORD is getting out to the individual worker bees who are charged with generating the actual nominations.

The nomination must be generated by the Voyageurs in the Voitures Locale and the nomination package for each category is then sent to their Grande Leadership by June 1st. The Grande Leadership then decides which nomination received is BEST for EACH category and then sends that nomination to the appropriate Judge by July 1st for consideration for the National Award. In summary, each Voiture Locale can submit only one nomination for each category to their Grande; the Grande can only send one nomination for each category to the Judge who is responsible for that category.

The Four Special Awards presented at Prom Nationale are City or Town of the Year, Hero of the Year, Voyageur of the Year and Law Enforcement Officer of the Year. Every Grande, at a minimum, should have no problem getting a Voyageur of the Year nomination submitted for someone in their Grande who is going above and beyond the call of duty.

The Sous Directeur's and Judges this year for each category are:
City or Town of the Year: Mildred S. Wright-

City or Town of the Year: Mildred S. Wright Pearson of California.

Hero of the Year: Sean D. Johnson of South Dakota.

Law Enforcement Officer of the Year: Lawson Dukes of Florida.

Voyageur of the Year: Donald T. Caudell, Jr. of Indiana.

Their contact information is located on Pages 1 and 4 of the Special Awards instructions. If there are a few minor problems with your nom, our Judges can assist you with correcting these in time. You may call the appropriate Judge or myself at 716 891 5164 (be sure to leave a message if I don't pick up). The July 1st deadline is just that. It's a DEADLINE. Do not expect late nominations to be considered as we are on a very tight schedule to have all in readiness by Promenade Nationale. There are many steps which need to be completed by my Committee members prior to Promenade Nationale. Having your nominations arrive a week before the deadline can be very helpful if/when errors are discovered so they can be fixed.

Please take the time to thoroughly read and reread the instructions: General Guidelines are on Page 1 and Nomination Guidelines are on Page 4.

The completed Official Nomination Form and the completed Participation Reporting Form must be included in your nomination package and all signatures must be in place. A separate nomination and package must be completed for each Special Award being submitted.

Please consider joining The General's Club which was established in order to assist with the costs for our Law Enforcement Officer of the Year. Your support allows us to continue these annual awards. Please also consider joining the new Blue Chevaliers Project which was started in November 2021. This is a two-fold opportunity to provide exposure for The 40 & 8 Society to the local community and

This is a two-fold opportunity to provide exposure for The 40 & 8 Society to the local community and to fight the demoralizing attempts to defund and demonize all law enforcement personnel. As Greg Hall (Special Awards Directeur National Passe) would say: "BACK THE BLUE".

We each took an un expiring oath to support and defend our country from all enemies, both foreign and domestic. We are requesting all Locales and Grandes to enthusiastically support this Project and to encourage your membership to join us. The initial dues are just \$15 which gets you a membership card and a beautiful Chapeau pin.

Renewal dues are just \$2 annually. Please view these minor expenses as a part of your investment and support for the future of La Societe.

The director of our civic chorale recently reminded us that within a span of 46 days we will celebrate Armed Forces Day, Memorial Day, Flag Day, and July 4th. At a time when patriotism wanes throughout our country, observance of these important days is more



important days is more important than ever. The director's selections for our Memorial Day concert include relevant references to each of the four significant days falling under the 46-day umbrella.

In November 1941 patients at Carville were challenged to enter an essay contest on "What Americanism means to me." Despite dealing with the life-changing impacts of Hansen's disease on their lives, the patriotism of Carville's patients shown through as documented in the following excerpts from their essays that were published in a 1941 edition of *The Star*:

"If God permits me to get well soon from my illness, I would like very much to join the Navy to help my country to defend itself. To be in the service under the Stars and Stripes is something every American should be proud of. As long as I am here I am helping my country by buying defense stamps"

(Patient - Flor Domingo)
"Americanism is justice, regardless of creed, race, or social status." (patient Marie L. Vasquez)

"Only in America could a hospital like this be found, where we sick are treated by our government, not as the least among men, but as the best. I thank God for the priceless heritage of Americanism, and pray that it may serve as a beacon in these dark days, to guide the world to a better and brighter future." (Patient Betty Martin)

These and other essays clearly demonstrate the patriotism and intense Americanism shared among the patient population at Carville. In the face of difficult and uncertain lives separated from families and friends, they remained patriotic and filled with Americanism. With the affluence and freedoms we enjoy in our country today, is there any reason we should not be even more patriotic than our predecessors from Carville?

In the November 1941 edition of *The Star*, the Medical Officer in Charge of Carville wrote "The Star is only a spark in the dark----Let us keep it burning and hope that it will serve to light up other beacons until the whole world will be made bright with the Truth." Now over 81 years later, *The Star* is published by La Société and continues to bring Truth about Hansen's disease to 29 countries in six continents, 22 states, and 14 clinics. AMERICANISM FRANK CAMPO **NATIONAL DIRECTEUR**

Bon Jour Voyageurs and Dames,

The below information was taken from the November 2022 issue of the Association of La Societe (PALS) newsletter sent out to those Voyageurs who belong to PALS.

The Americanism Program of La Societe is literally a gold mine from

the perspective of public relations. Now is the time to grab a copy of the Americanism Consolidated Report and review it - not wait until May or June. I go down the report and see category after category that is prime for press and media releases. Americanism pin sales is greatly important but only a small part of this important program. It doesn't take a detailed assessment to clearly see that Americanism is community based.

So, public relations must be used to promote a positive image for La Societe - and Americanism is the perfect platform to do so. We need to publicly state who we are, what we do and why we matter and Americanism is at the heart of it. The majority of us are also members of other fraternal and Veterans organizations.

Those things that we accomplish or participate with them obviously overlap. Ever heard of "No taxation without representation"? The founding fathers had quite a few slogans and key phrases that promoted for their cause. In PR, it is important to always remember your core Americanism message when pitching reporters, writing press releases, facilitating interviews, and in almost any oth-Organizing and promoting Americanism events in the community is one way PR can attract media attention to promote your locales inter-

Events can be a great way for Voyageurs Militaire to interact with many members of the media at once, as well as provide an opportunity to showcase your locale and mission. Events also provide a forum to discuss with the media who you are and what you do and spark ideas for future media opportunities. But, the media has to be informed and invited and followed up with-you've got to consider press releases.

Perseverance is just as important in PR. Just because a pitch doesn't land a positive response on the first try doesn't mean you should give up. Following up with reporters and thinking of new ways to position previously unsuccessful opportunities is some of the most difficult PR work we do. Creativihaving an ty is a major part of this process, and open mind to forging new paths can make working in PR much easier.

This is November and February is still a bit off but not that far that we should not be considering taking advantage of February being "Americanism" month nationally. February is of course a busy month with a Presidential holiday and Valentines Day - but as Americanism Month it should be a time to "foster and perpetuate" our nations ished American traditions.

And La Societe has a lot of them. Every Locale is part of a city and county - consider a government proclamation declaring February as Americanism NATIONAL DIRECTEUR Month and honoring the Forty and Eight including your locale for its Americanism role in your community. Include such areas as Flags for First Graders, flag retirements, school award presentations, law enforcement recognition, support of youth activities, Americanism activities in your communities (be specific), VAVS activities could all be part of the proclamation.

We will provide a sample proclamation below. Key ways to promote Americanism... Americanism pin sales-not just for your chapeau or jacket-but to hand out to others demonstrating support for the program and promoting La Societe. Educating our children on flag history and etiquette through the Flags for First Graders Program. We must teach and encourage children to love and respect their flag and country in order to grow their national pride.

Consistent and accurate Americanism reporting from the locale and Grande, a big area that needs improvement. We must follow La Societes rituals, customs and support our programs - all programs

are part of our Americanism spirit.

Spotlight on Americanism

Proclamations A proclamation is an official way for local government leaders to make an official announcement. Although there are a few steps involved, overall it's a very easy thing to accomplish - particularly if you draft the proclamation for your leader(s).

First, visit your governments (or Mayor-County Judge) webpage and look for anything to do with "proclamations." Some will actually spell out how to ask for a proclamation and even give you a template to follow. Otherwise, use the site's search feature and type in the word "proclamation."

Another option is to look on the "Contact Us" tab. This page may allow you to write a brief message asking about how to proceed. Title—Start with a basic title, which explains the proclamation. Write Reasoning Statements Identify the reasons behind your proclamation. Keep it straightforward and simple.

Start each statement with "Whereas," followed by the reason. Write The Proclamation Statement - Explain what you are proclaiming, based on the above-listed reasons. Start the sentence with "Now, therefore" and be sure to include the author's name, position, organization, location, and the date. This statement should be written in the first person. Determine what date period is being covered - a specific day, a week, a month or a

Proclamations can be for our suggested Americanism Month in February or for one of many Americanism

TITLE WHEREAS (As many as necessary to get the point across, usually several) NOW, THEREFORE

PERSONAL INVITATION (Underneath proclamation statement, personally invite readers to support and participate in your proclamation) Sometimes the process of government is slow. Typically a request for a proclamation for a Governors signature-plan on two months. A Presidential Proclamation could take many months-give it three to six months. In addition to seeking the specific guidelines for requesting a proclamation, be sure to inquire about the preferred format. This information will allow you to begin to draft an effective proclamation. Examples...

WHEREAS The Forty & Eight was founded in 1920 by American veterans returning from France. The titles and symbols of The Forty and Eight are derived from the experiences of U.S. troops during World War I such a "boxcars" used to transport "40 men or 8" horses to the front



I know it's early, but I would like to go over some elements of the Child Welfare Annual Report. Every-25 cents of your dues is one pays their dues. earmarked to Child Welfare efforts. You can't avoid your participation! That means, you can and should report your Locale effort on the annual Child Welfare report to your Grand Directeur (or Grand Correspondant) if your Grand Chef has not appointed someone to handle the ORIGINAL charitable effort of the Forty and Eight. The Report Form is divided in 3 sections:

SECTION A Assistance and services provided by the Locale, CASH MONEY SPENT Participation by Voyageurs hours and miles does not count here.

SECTION B Assistance and other services provided. Transportation provided, holiday gifts, children's parties, etc. AGAIN, Voyageur hours and miles don't count here

SECTION C This is where Voyageur hours and miles are recorded. Pins Sold? Direct donations to the National Child Welfare Program, and finally, the # of Voyageurs X .25 each. If that's all your Local did, REPORT it! There's no excuse for not bragging about your effort! Remember. Local Reports go to your Grande, Grand Reports totaling Locale activity need to be sent to me by July 15. Report Forms in PDF or Word Format are on the National Web Site www.fortyandeight,org, Resources, Forms & Petit Communique.

I hope everyone celebrated the Birthday of La Societe this past month and forwarded pictures to the 40 et 8er magazine.

As I mentioned last month, this is the time of the year to plan your Calvin Kane Memorial Service on or around Memorial Day. The



Calvin Kane Memorial Service is a stand-alone service and should not be included during a Promenade. If you plan to hold the Calvin Kane Memorial Service at the time of a Promenade, do it before or after the Promenade not during the Promenade.

In the Ritual and Manual of Ceremonies, in the Order of Business of a Promenade, after the Roll Call of Officers the next item is Memorial Service for a Deceased Voyageur. This Memorial Service is completely different than the Calvin Kane Memorial Service. The Memorial Service for a Deceased Voyageur should be held during a first promenade after the death of one of your Voyageurs. Hopefully a short Eulogy will be given in memory of the Deceased Voyageur. Make yourself familiar with this Voyageur. service which includes the Chef de Gare, Chef de Train, Commis Voyageur, and Conducteur if needed. The Ritual and Manual of Ceremonies suggests a six feet long black ribbon, which will give three feet of double ribbon as a drape for your Voiture Banner.

A reminder to all Grande Voitures and Voitures Locales that the National Color Guard Competition will be held at Promenade Nationale in September. This is the time to practice for the competition.

Keep track of your time and expenses for your Ritual Report which is coming due.

At Promenade Nationale, the National Ritual Committee will meet and discuss matters of Ritual. On the National 40 et 8 website under Ritual is this instruction:

It is recommended that each Grande Voiture and Voiture Locale have a Ritual Committee. Their duties should be to study thoroughly the Ritual & Manual of Ceremonies and offer suggestions to improve it to the Permanent Ritual Committee for its consideration and recommendation to the Promenade Nationale.

Suggestions for improving our Ritual can be brought up at the National Ritual Meeting upon proper acceptance of your notion.

Legislative Body

The legislative body of La Société shall be the Promenade Nationale, which shall be constituted of its constituent units, which are the various Grandes and individual Voitures Locales. Each constituent unit may act in congress or in separation of any other unit. The law of such Promenade Shall be the National Constitution of La Société des 40 Hommes et 8 Chevaux, as Amended by the Ninety-Fifth Promenade Nationale on September 27, 2014; and Roberts Rules of Order, current edition, to the extent such Rules do not conflict with the Constitution. Forwarding of Promenade Nationale Related Reports and Documents All matters relating to the

Promenade Nationale should be addressed to the Correspondant National at 250 East 38th Steet, Indianapolis, Indiana 46205, and shall be forwarded so as to reach the Correspondant National NO LATER THAN Friday, August 4, 2023.

Delegates, Alternates, and Basis of Representation

In accordance with Section 3, Article VI, of the Nationale Constitution, each Grande Voiture shall be entitled to five (5) Delegates and five (5) Alternates, and every Voiture Locale shall be entitled to one (1) Aldernate for its first fifty (50) members, and every Voiture Locale shall be entitled to one (1) additional Delegate and one (1) additional Alternate for each additional fifty (50) members, or major fraction there-

In addition thereto, and in accordance with Section 4, Article VI, of the National Constitution, Voiture Locale 174, District of Columbia, and Voiture Latin America shall each be entitled to five (5) Delegates and five (5) Alternates for their first fifty members, and shall be further entitled to one (1) additional Delegate and one (1) additional Alternate for each additional fifty (50) members, or major fraction thereof.

Delegates may serve as a delegate for only one constituent unit (a Grande or a Voiture Locale) and must have been elected as a Delegate for such constituent unit, and must be a member of the constituent they represent. However, a Delegate may also be elected as an Alternate in any other constituent unit to which the Voyageur is a member.

Alternate may be elected as an Alternate in more than one constituent unit, if the Alternate is a member of each such constituent unit. An Alternate may only be promoted to serve as a Delegate at Promenade Nationale for a constituent unit in which the Alternate was duly elected as an Alternate. Membership will be calculated on the basis of members properly reported as of August 4, 2023 which is the date thirty (30) day prior to the convening of the Promenade Nationale, as provided in Section 3, Article VI of

The preliminary Convention Roll will be made up at the close of business on August 4, 2023.

Upon certification to the Credentials official of an absence in a delegation of constituent unit, an Alternate may be certified as a Delegate for such constituent unit. Upon such certification, the Alternate being promoted shall thereafter be referred to as a Delegate so long as they serve as a Delegate, and shall receive the credentials and indicia of a Delegate. Upon certification to the Credentials official of the attendance of previously absent Delegate, any Alternate promoted to fill such Delegate's position shall be reduced to Alternate again, and shall surrender any and all credentials and indicia of the once of Delegate.

Grande Voitures and Voitures Locales are urged to give the matter of election of Delegates and Alternates the serious consideration it deserves, and elect Voyageurs who will give their time to attend to the business matters to come before the Promenade Nationale.

Credentials, Contests and Filling Vacancies of Delegation
Certification of the election of Delegates and Alternates by each Grande and each Voiture Locale shall be delivered to the Correspondant National NOT LATER THAN August 4, 2023. The Certification shall clearly identify the constituent unit (the Grande or the Voiture Locale); the date of such election; the name, address and telephone number(s) of each Delegate elected; the name, address and telephone number(s) of each Alternate

elected; the desiN1ation of which Delegate the Alternate shall stand for in the absence of the Delegate; and any Instructions voted and passed by the constituent unit.

Delegate and Alternate credentials will be available for pickup by the designated individual Voyageurs, upon presentation of proof of identity, at the Promenade Registration and Check-In site.

The Credentials Official of the Promenade shall consist of the Credentials Committee of the Credentials Committee of unit of the Credentials Committee of the Credentials Commi Delegate or Alternate; regarding the absence or attendance of a Delegate, and the promotion or reduction of an Alternate; or regarding any other related matter, then such contests, claims, complaint, challenges or certifications shall be presented to the Credentials official of the Promenade. The manner of casting and counting votes at Promenade Nationale shall be in the order of precedence set forth in Roberts Rules of Order, latest edition. Roll Call Votes shall be by the constituent units of the Promenade, which are the Grandes and the individual Voitures Locales, and the attending Chefs de Chemin de Fer Passe

In accordance with Section 1, Article XV of the National Constitution of La Societe, proposed amendments to the National Constitution must be submitted in writing to the First Business Session of Promenade Nationale. Proposed amendments should be forwarded to Voiture Nationale, 250 East 38th Street, Indianapolis, Indiana 46205, at the earliest opportunity after passage by Grand Promenade, but not later than the end of business on Friday, August 4, 2023.


